*Paul, a bond-servant of Christ Jesus, called as an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which He promised beforehand through His prophets in the holy Scriptures...*

*Romans 1:1-2*



*...concerning His Son, who was born of a descendant of David according to the flesh, who was declared the Son of God with power according to the Spirit of holiness by the resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord...*

*Romans 1:3-4*

*As a human, He was from the family of David. But the Holy Spirit proved that Jesus is the powerful Son of God, because He was raised from death.*

*For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh...*

*For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in **the likeness of sinful flesh** and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh...*

*Romans 8:3*

*...but emptied Himself by taking the form of a bond-servant and being born in **the likeness** of men.*
